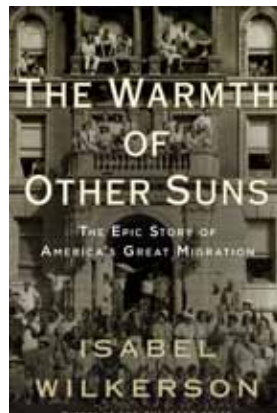
The Warmth of Other Suns with Isabel Wilkerson
